3,000+ Meals Served Across the Islands
From emergency aid to daily support, our outreach teams distributed over 3,000 meals across the islands—each one served with love, offering nourishment, comfort, and the reassurance that no child is forgotten.

The Crisis Continues

The quarter was not without heartbreak. On O‘ahu, government-led clean sweeps displaced over 150 homeless children, forcing many to leave the only shelter they knew.

On the Big Island, similar large-scale sweeps have left dozens of children missing and unaccounted for. Our team continues to search, to reconnect, and to bring help where it is needed most.

In Maui, we provided relief to an encampment of 12 children, supplying new tents and equipment to restore a sense of safety and stability after they were displaced. **The need is overwhelming—but so is our determination.**

Dormitory Project

A Dream Becoming Reality

Our dormitory program made a major leap forward this quarter. We completed the construction of individual student rooms, creating safe, private spaces where our teens can focus on school and personal growth. We are now working on the final touches to our communal kitchen, transforming it into a welcoming space for shared meals and life lessons.

This dorm isn't just a place to sleep—it's a launchpad for our youth to escape generational poverty and achieve lasting success.
